As a member of the Senior Management Team on the WHP You will provide vision and direction, across our operational areas (Midlands, East Anglia, Home Counties, West London) .

You will be required to manage the team and the Network to a given budget and therefore, the ability to lead within financial targets is required.

Using a social prescription approach, Support Managers on the Work and Health programme will signpost participants to access these interventions and the H&WB provider Development managers will monitor uptake / capacity / innovation / changing needs and impact.

Flexibility in your aproach will be required as we need an active network of providers reflecting the changing participant needs throughout the life of programmes.

You will be highly experienced in line managing people to given objectives and expecting results. You will be able to provide support to the team to continually develop them to manage partners capacity and performance. An important part of the role is to ensure

providers are providing assurance and quality to H&WB standards, the Biopsychosocial model and 5 Ways to wellbeing.

This role is perfect for someone with a background in health and social care contract management with the ability to capacity build a diverse range of health providers. It is essential that the person understands how the objectives of their team support overall contract Key Performance Indicators so you will have experience of working in a target driven environment. An understanding of how the development of community-based services impacts the lives of people with mental health challenges is essential.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

1. Embrace and enact the Shaw Trust vision and direction for the growth and success of the WHP contract and delivery network by creating a sense of purpose which aligns with the Commissioner Expectations
2. Provide skilful and proactive relationship management both internally and externally ensuring positive and productive relationships are established and maintained.
3. To provide all aspects of strong leadership to a team of geographically spread Development Managers ensuring a high performing team through effective performance management processes.

4. Set personal development and performance targets for direct reports and ensure these are met, providing appropriate support and taking necessary action if set targets are not being achieved.
5. Effectively lead the team of H&WB Provider Development managers to ensure they act as the focal point for internal and network delivery staff queries relating to the Shaw Trust approach to delivering health and wellbeing services.
6. Identify, mitigate and report on Risks and Issues to the Head of Health and Wellbeing, Head of Work and Health Programme and the Director for Employability.
7. Work to a given budget ensuring that financial targets are met and corrective actions are taken on any variances.
8. Be resilient and adaptable to work across different reporting lines and ensure consistency of information, reporting and progress.
9. Analyse and share regular reports/MI with operational delivery teams and Network partners, Identifying trends that impact on effective delivery of the service, agreeing remedial or improvement action where required.
10. Capacity build a diverse range of organisations and stakeholders in order to achieve service delivery that meets commissioner and participant needs.
11. Regularly performance manage and hold to account, providers and partners, for their contractual performance, KPI's and targets, agreeing remedial actions in a timely manner where required.
12. Ensure an effective, yet proportionate approach is taken with regard to contract management, implementing the principles of market stewardship.
13. Use agreed tools and techniques with the delivery partners to ensure each delivers as per their contractual obligations, thereby meeting quality assurance standards and compliance.
14. Work with delivery partners to ensure facilitation of best practice, continuous improvement in contract delivery and integration of the participant journey in order to meet the required contractual outputs.
15. Ensure each area has captured and provided analysis on delivery partners' performance through robust MI
16. Ensure delivery partners operate safely and within relevant legislative guidelines appropriate to health and wellbeing.
17. Work with delivery partners to create alliances with other agencies who provide tangible outcomes.
18. Ensure a rich, local partnership portfolio with charities and voluntary organisations is established across the geographical footprint that is supporting our participants. This should be built on existing community asset mapping and ensuring its continual improvement via input from delivery network, support managers and participants or carers.

19. Promote and sell the Shaw Trust in the community service to relevant parties, leading to further business opportunities.

Other Responsibilities

1. To undertake any further training as identified in the Shaw Trust review procedures.
2. Ensure that safe working practices are followed in respect of COSHH and other Risk Assessment control measures.
3.
