This role is working on a DWP Work and Health Programme - Job Entry: Targeted Support (WHP/JETS)

### Purpose

As a WHP JETS Employment Advisor you will be providing advice and support to guide and encourage participants to overcome barriers to employment and achieve realistic job goals. This will be mainly delivered remotely via phone, video conference and other digital channels.

The role holder will be expected to manage a caseload of participants, supporting their journey to employment, offer advice and direction to enable participants to access support they need. The role will also involve re-building participant confidence and self-efficacy following a period on unemployment.

### Main Duties and Responsibilities

1. Manage a caseload of participants requiring additional support prior to entering employment.
2. Maintain participant records in line with contract and funding requirements.
3. Ensure regular Advisor / participant contact is maintained and recorded for the duration of the programme.
4. Use diagnostic screening, assessments and skills analysis to support participants consider all options available to them to gain employment.
5. Provide advice and support to develop realistic job goals with participants and agree tailored action plans.
6. Refer participants to internal and external advice, guidance and support in line with their tailored action plan.
7. Monitor participant progress against agreed action plans, providing advice and support as well as onward referrals and sign-posting.
8. Maintain awareness of employment opportunities available within your designated geographic area, highlighting these to participants as appropriate.
9. Maintain an up to date working knowledge of the local labour market, training opportunities and relevant support agencies.

10. Re-building participant confidence and self-efficacy in the post-COVID landscape through supportive interaction and sign-posting to required activities and training.

## Other

1. To undertake any further training as identified in the Shaw Trust review procedures.
2. Ensure that safe working practices are followed in respect of COSHH and other Risk Assessment control measures.
3. Employees must comply with the provisions of 'The Health and Safety at Work Act 1974' and must take reasonable care for the health and safety of themselves and of other persons who may be affected by their acts or omissions whilst at work. Employees are also required to co-operate with their employer to enable them to perform or comply with any statutory provisions. The Trust's efforts to promote a safe and healthy working environment can only succeed with the full co-operation of its employees.

The work is of a confidential nature and information gained must not be communicated to other persons except in the recognised course of duty. The post holder must meet the requirements of the Data Protection Act at all times.
7. Be aware of, promote and implement Shaw Trust's Quality and Information Security Management Systems.
8. To report to Line manager, or other appropriate person, in the event of awareness of bad practice.
9. Recycle and manage energy within your environment.
10. Ensure that good practice is shared across employment services and with the wider organisation.
11. Actively promote and embed the Trust's behaviours.
